RESOLUTION SMOKE FREE CAMPUS

Resolved: Beginning August 1, 2013, CSUF shall be a smoke free campus.

Rationale: the science is beyond reproach. It is more than well documented that smoking is not healthy. The present CSUF policy is hard to enforce and frequently is not. More and more campuses and organizations around the country are smoke and tobacco free. First year students coming from high schools likely graduated from smoke free schools. A lion share of our transfer students come from community colleges that are also smoke free.

Why August 1, 2013? This 18 month window provides time for the administration to create awareness and education programs as part of changing the campus culture. Plus this gives time, in consultation with appropriate units, to prepare the necessary materials, develop cessation programs, etc.

Background: The California State University Board of Trustees delegated authority to campus Presidents to adopt rules regulating smoking on campuses. California State University, Fullerton is committed to providing a healthy and productive campus environment. The health risks associated with second hand smoke have been researched and documented. The State of California prohibits smoking in all public buildings and other enclosed areas of employment Authority to issue this Policy is based on Title 5, California Code of Regulations, Section 42356, State of California Executive Order W-42-93; State Government Code Section 19994.31; State Labor Code Section 6404.5; and CSU Executive Order 599.

Recommended Implementation: All vehicles owned, leased or rented by the University or a University auxiliary or used for official university business shall be smoke free. Smoke-generating tobacco products shall not be sold or distributed in any manner on campus. Effective implementation of this policy depends upon all members of the University community acting with common courtesy and sensitivity to others. Managers and administrators are responsible for informing all employees in their charge and all newly hired employees of this policy. The Office of Environmental Health and Instructional Safety will collaborate with the following entities on campus to provide faculty, staff, students and visitors with notice of this Policy through signs, information campaigns or other publications.

- (a) Student Health Center
- (b) Counseling & Psychological Services
- (c) International Education & Exchange Office
- (d) other relevant campus entities

"An education/publicity/outreach campaign, both before and after implementation of this policy, will be coordinated by a committee or task force, with representatives from: (a) the Office of Environmental Health & Instructional Safety; (b) the Student Health Center; (c) Counseling & Psychological Services; (d) the International Education & Exchange Office; (e) other relevant campus entities."

N.B. Smoking is defined as inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or other lighted smoking product.
